Hadrien Loumaye artistic focus centers on the interplay between gesture and color within his work. Within his paintings, movement embodies a distinct physical energy, while the array of colors shapes a transparent state, evoking emotions in the viewer. He aims to merge the subjective essence of abstract expressionism with the meticulous production of minimalism. Confronting the challenge of the pictorial frame, he disrupts compositional balance using varied colored planes, playful horizons, and elements that accentuate surfaces with gestural emphasis, encapsulating the creative act's vitality and enabling the diffusion of pure color.


His artistic exploration takes diverse forms, spanning from traditional paintings to expansive murals. To connect this new series with the exhibiting space, he has intervened within the exhibition area. This intervention serves as an opportunity to further delve into the essence of gesture while subverting the conventional hierarchy between the floor and walls. He intertwines various scales and mediums, reusing certain pictorial gestures in alternative forms, such as drawing, to offer unique perspectives on these artistic disciplines.

He earned an MFA in Painting from ENSAV La Cambre in Brussels in 2023. His recent solo exhibition, "Liminal Surface" took place at 10N in Brussels in 2023. Additionally, his work has been featured in institutional exhibitions such as "I think I've been there before" at KCCC Klaipeda, curated by Natalia Barczyńska in Klaipėda, LTI. Loumaye's artwork is included in the public collections of the Kruppa Art Foundation in Wroclaw, PL. He won the Nosco Gallery Art Prize in 2023. He has recently served as an artist-in-residence at Bouchor in Paris and The Green Corridor in Brussels. He has also collaborated with Hans Theys on a book that delves into his artistic practice and body of work.







Whiteout

28 November > 21 December 2024

This exhibition unveils new pictorial assemblages, the fruit of an exploratory approach that brings together distinct paintings to generate interaction between different color fields. One of the innovations lies in the transformation of the frames themselves: some abandon standard formats, their lower parts being cut away to create a visual tension between the color and its host form.

The title of the exhibition, *Whiteout*, pays homage to the last work by Jan Andriesse, who died in 2021. This choice underlines a sensitive and conceptual filiation with his work. In meteorology, "whiteout" refers to a diffuse light where sky and snow seem to merge, erasing all shadows and clear boundaries.


The paintings presented take a minimalist approach, while exploring chromatic nuances in greater depth. A typical composition is divided into two parts: a rectangle in the upper section and an organic form, floating almost independently. Inspired by Matisse's cut-outs, this approach translates into painting the idea of "sculpted" color that transcends the flat surface to become volume.

Bringing two paintings together also marks an encounter: a clear contrast between colored fields, but also an intimate relationship between two distinct entities. This duality is inspired by Félix González-Torres' *Untitled (Perfect Lovers)*, where juxtaposition evokes a tension between individuality and unity.

Some compositions incorporate lines drawn in pencil, crossing the pictorial space to reinforce the idea of connection and division. This formal reduction is in keeping with the tradition of minimal art, but the expressive, bodily gesture characteristic of my painting introduces a tension with the codes of minimal art. This contradiction, deliberately maintained, fuels a dynamic between rigor and spontaneity.

The in situ intervention extends these questions by going beyond the limits of the frame. With no preliminary sketch, the work emerges from a dialogue with the architectural space. The triangular shape introduced in this intervention responds to the painting suspended at 45° on the main wall, a nod to Piet Mondrian's *Diamond Compositions*.

Finally, this exhibition includes a ceramic piece that establishes a dialogue between raw material, color and gesture. The fingerprints left in the raw clay capture a direct bodily presence, while the color, applied instinctively, reflects the ephemeral movement of the hand over the material. The areas in which the natural color of the clay remains apparent recall the origins of this practice, inscribing my work in a historical continuity while affirming its contemporaneity.




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
