

Jonathan Rosić

1979, Belgium – Lives in Brussels

Jonathan Rosić's work reflects on our impermanence and our micro-disparitions. He lists, analyzes and amplifies the small cancellations of ourselves and tries to make perceptible the fading of time. His meticulous Indian ink drawings were inspired by film stills, personal or found photographs. These inks focus on moments of voluntary or random concealment, on scenes of solitude, oblivion and incommunicability, on subjects or objects disappearing behind ambiguous gestures. The disappearance is expressed at different levels (that of the subject, hidden, or whose gaze is obstructed; that of the spectator, for the represented subject who does not see us anymore; that of the image, by dissipation by means of very diluted tones; finally, that of the artist's hand, by a non-gestural technique, voluntarily placing him in the background behind his subject). In addition to his drawings, Jonathan Rosić lists, within the banal and intimate world of found photos, clues to our erasure: repetitive traces, classified into gestural categories, where the sign of absence becomes sculptural.

Trained as an architect (La Cambre, Brussels), Jonathan Rosić has taught architecture, and studied painting (La Cambre). His awards include the Sabam Prize (Art Contest, Brussels, 2014), the Marcel Hastir Prize – Portrait (Royal Academy of Belgium, 2017) and the FID Prize International Drawing Prize (Paris, 2017). His work has been recently shown in a solo exhibition at Archiraar Gallery (Brussels), at Approche (Paris, 2022) and at Drawing Now (Paris, 2023).







Touching from a Distance

Jonathan Rosić accumulates evidence of our incommunicability and gathers clues to our disappearance. With rigorous obsession, he catalogues and archives these "pieces of evidence": an existential investigation into the abyss of the banal. His Indian ink drawings are inspired by vernacular photographs in his collection.


The series *Touching from a Distance* are based on old promotional photographs of inventions. Reproducing them in Indian ink, Jonathan Rosić subtracts the objects depicted and focuses solely on the hands now presenting only emptiness.

In search of the missing piece, Jonathan Rosić is a collector of shapes and words. He strives to say the same thing differently, to create an echo. In this doubling, an irruption of signs warns of danger and bears witness to the paradoxical aspects of the chronicle. Critical, unifying and utopian potential is unearthed in the heart of the most familiar scene. From the manipulation of the document to its meticulous duplication in ink, Jonathan Rosić seeks the possibility of History: a dialogue with our dreams and memories.

With the *Ghosts* series, Jonathan Rosić recycles original snapshots taken from the clutter of "amateur photography", the abandoned intimacy of anonymous people. These strangers evade each other in gestures that move aside, but participatory gestures suggesting the mute interaction between photographer and photographed. Roland Barthes evokes this refusal: "photography (...) represents that very subtle moment when (...) I am neither a subject nor an object, but rather a subject who feels himself becoming an object: I then live the micro-experience of death (...), I really become a spectre". The modesty – whether artificial or not – of these ghosts makes photography an abyss: showing the eclipse of ghosts.

The *This is...* series features the backs of found photographs. The deictic expression "this is", a display word, points to elements of reality that escape our gaze.


